# Jefferson EDGE 2020 HOSPITALS Status Report 3: October 2010

#### **Hospitals**

In response to concerns about quality of life in Jefferson Parish and its impact upon the community's economic competitiveness, JEDCO initiated the Jefferson Edge 2020 Quality of Life initiative. This initiative has produced eight "strategic implementation plans" which include a series of action items to address particular quality of life issues. Implementing the action items requires the total cooperation and keen interest of all involved, including JEDCO, the Jefferson Parish government, numerous other entities, and frequently State and Federal agencies. In 2008, JEDCO retained GCR & Associates, Inc. to prepare semiannual reports outlining the status of each of these action items and overall progress toward implementation.

The following table summarizes the progress made toward each of the health care (H) action items.

The findings of this inquiry have not yet been made available, but a change in reimbursement rates would mean a more equitable level of compensation for the service district hospitals. Complete program design in 2009- 2010; implement program in 2010- 2011	The Medicaid program has undergone a dramatic overhaul as a result of federal health care reform, which was signed into law in the spring of 2010. The new law, for instance, would dramatically expand Medicaid eligibility. However, final rulemaking has yet to be published in the federal register. The final rules, following public comment, should be published in mid-summer of 2011.  In the meantime, East Jefferson and West Jefferson are already in the process of enrolling individuals who were not previously enrolled in Medicaid.	Monitor federal rulemaking pertaining to expanded Medicaid eligibility under the new health reform law. Determine whether existing practices are adequate to maximize enrollment of and reimbursement from Medicaid patients.			
H4	Work with the State's Department of Health and Hospitals to establish a "certificate of need" program for specialty hospitals	Complete program design in 2010; pass legislation in 2010-2011	Currently, a large specialty hospital is being built in Metairie that underscores the challenges facing full service hospitals to retain paying patients. At the state level, there has been no appetite for any measures that would limit the spread of specialty hospitals. At the local level, zoning regulations could preclude this kind of development, but such regulations have not found a sponsor on the Parish Council.	Determine the need for or interest in local zoning regulations to restrict the proliferation of specialty hospitals. Identify a potential sponsor for such a measure on the Parish Council.

This is the concern that motivated this action item. To date, very little that pertains to the planned LSU hospital has been discussed in an open forum, and the JEDCO hospitals strikeforce has expressed skepticism that it is in a position to significantly affect the outcome of the project in any meaningful way. Thus, for the foreseeable future the strikeforce will continue to monitor progress on the LSU hospital and keep health care stakeholders in Jefferson informed.	Continue to monitor progress and any programmatic details regarding the planned LSU Hospital. Communicate updates to health care stakeholders in Jefferson Parish.

The purpose of the certificate of public advantage is to address/satisfy anti-trust concerns. After the certificate is finalized, both hospitals will be able to explore opportunities for coordination.  The certificate of public advantage is currently being finalized by the attorney working on the matter. Through Forward Jefferson, a Jefferson-based 501c3 and an affiliate of JEDCO, JEDCO submitted a letter of interest for an \$8,000 grant for a healthy communities plan. Unfortunately, the letter of interest did not advance to the full application stage.	Continue to search for additional external funding sources. As a result, this action item is being tabled indefinitely. The budget outlook at both the state and local levels is not favorable, making it unlikely that the Parish would find another revenue source for Medicaid matching funds	A one time distribution from traffic camera revenues (that are the subject of on-going litigation) is possible. Monitor ongoing litigation, and attempt to secure a portion of the one-time payment for local hospitals.  Work with the Parish Council to identify a potential revenue source to replace traffic camera revenues in order to secure Medicaid funding.	No longer applicable.
