Business Incentives

Industrial Tax Exemption Program:

Abates, up to ten years, local property taxes (ad valorem) on a manufacturer's improvements to the land, buildings, machinery, equipment and any other property that is part of the manufacturing process. The land itself is not eligible for tax exemption.*

Enterprise Zone Program:

Provides Louisiana income and corporate franchise tax credits to businesses hiring new employees. Of the new hires 35 percent must be from one of four targeted groups. To qualify, a business must add at least five new jobs within two years or increase its statewide workforce employment by 10 percent within one year, whichever is less. A partial sales/use tax rebate may be available on qualified purchases or a refundable investment income tax credit equal to 1 1/2 percent of certian capital expenditures can be

Quality Jobs Program:

Provides both payroll and sales/use tax rebates or a refundable state investment income tax credit to companies in targeted industries, including but not limited to manufacturing companies. Employers must pay at least \$14.50 in hourly wages and offer a basic health benefit plan with a value of at least \$1.25 per hour for each new direct job. Within three years, new jobs must increase an employer's annual payroll by \$250,000 for companies with less than 50 fulltime employees or \$500,000 in new annual payroll for those employing 50 or more employees.*

Inventory Tax Credit:

Manufacturers, distributors and retailers are eligible to receive a 100 percent credit toward state income and corporate franchise taxes of local inventory taxes paid.

Research & Development Tax Credit:

Encourages Louisiana businesses to invest in and increase their existing levels of R&D by offering tax credits against state income and corporation franchise taxes.

Financing

JEDCO's financing programs are designed to assist Jefferson Parish-based businesses with financing of fixed assets, working capital and inventory. These programs have been established to assist with economic development and have the primary objective of job creation.

JEDCO's financing sources include:

- Industrial Revenue Bonds (tax exempt for manufacturers)
- Gulf Opportunity (GO) Zone Tax Exempt Bonds (through December 31, 2010)
- U.S. Small Business Administration 504 Loan Program
- Economic Development Administration
 Title IX Revolving Loan Program
- Housing and Urban Development CDBG Revitalization Loans

Corporate Jobs Tax Credit:

A one-time income tax credit ranging from \$100 to \$225 for each new job created by any corporation that establishes or expands in Louisiana.

Manufacturing Sales Tax Exclusion:

Effective January 1, 2006, Jefferson Parish-based manufacturers no longer pay <u>local</u> sales and use tax on the purchase and/or lease of qualified machinery and equipment.

In addition, the <u>state</u>'s sales and use tax is being phased-out on the purchase and/or lease of machin-

ery and equipment by manufacturers. The phase-out of sales and use tax on the purchase or lease of machinery and equipment by manufacturers began on July 1, 2004 with a five percent exclusion of the price of eligible machinery and equipment upon which the state's four percent sales tax is computed. The phase-out increased annually with a 100 percent exclusion on July 1, 2009.

Workforce & Business Development Resources Workforce Training Grants

On-the-Job or Customized Training:

Funded through the federal Workforce Investment Act, employers can offset the cost associated with training new employees who lack the skills typically required to obtain employment in a chosen occupation. Provides reimbursement of 50 percent of the trainee's wages during on-site training or 50 percent of the cost of classroom instruction.

Small Business Employee Training Program (SBET):

Through SBET, companies with 50 or less employees can upgrade the skills of workers through standardized (off-the-shelf) training. Employers may apply for full reimbursement of the cost of tuition and materials for courses taken for non-credit or in an audit capacity at Louisiana institutions, courses available through industry associations, or training provided by equipment manufacturers.

Incumbent Worker Training Program (IWTP):

Administered by the Louisiana Department of Labor, IWTP awards grants to businesses to finance customized training to improve the skills of existing employees. Employers partner with training institutions to develop a training plan that fits the company's scheduling and curriculum needs.
