Two Jefferson Parish Hospitals Ranked #1 in the State

Two Jefferson Parish hospitals received the number one ranking for the state of Louisiana, according to U.S. News and World Report's 2013-14 Best Hospitals list. Ochsner Medical Center and Ochsner Medical Center – West Bank held national rankings in eight, out of 12, medical specialties. It's an accomplishment only 35 hospitals in the country can share.

Ocshner Medical Center and Ochsner Medical Center-West Bank were ranked:

#16 in Gastroenterology and GI Surgery

#21 in Diabetes and Endocrinology

#24 in Pulmonology

#24 in Cardiology and Heart Surgery

#31 in Orthopedics

#35 in Neurology and Neurosurgery

#42 in Geriatrics

#45 in Nephrology

These eight national rankings put the two medical centers at the top of the list for Louisiana, making them the only hospitals nationally ranked in the state. They are also ranked #1 in the New Orleans metro area, followed by Ochsner Medical Center-Kenner.

Ochsner has been recognized as one of the Best Hospitals in America 13 times since 1996, ranking nationally in seven or more medical specialties in the past three years.

"Ochsner is a vital asset to the Jefferson Parish and Greater New Orleans communities," says Jerry Bologna, the executive director of the Jefferson Parish Economic Development Commission (JEDCO). "As the largest private employer in Louisiana, Ochsner drives the economy on a number of levels. Not only does it create jobs in the medical industry for our residents, but it also brings new people to our area. This ranking underscores the fact that Jefferson Parish is home to some of the best healthcare available anywhere."

"Ochsner has been consistently named among the best hospitals in America by U.S. News and World Report," Warner Thomas, President and Chief Executive Officer of Ochsner Health System, said in a press release. "This shows how well our Ochsner physicians and our independent physicians have worked together to build a nationally recognized, high-quality healthcare organization focused on serving our patients."

U.S. News and World Report publishes the Best Hospitals list annually. The rankings are based on a number of criteria, including patient survival rates, patient safety data, nurse staffing, patient services, available technology, physician surveys and reputation. A New Frontier

JEDCO's May/June 2013 Newsletter

(Avondale, La) - Summer is officially upon us and we, here at <u>JEDCO</u>, are pretty excited. No, we're not talking about swapping our business attire for bathing suits and beaches (although many of us are hoping for some fun in the sun this summer). Instead, we're really thrilled about a major project that was just completed in time for the sunny season: the <u>Huey P. Long Bridge Widening Project.</u>



The only direct connection between the East and West Banks of the Mississippi River in Jefferson Parish, the Huey P. Long Bridge is an iconic structure with a long history. But on June 16th, after a more than six year-long widening project, the bridge helped Jefferson Parish <u>look to the future</u>. Community and business leaders have already attributed economic growth in the parish thanks to the newly-widened landmark, with no signs of slowing. Just take a look at the <u>Elmwood Shopping</u> Center to see what we mean.

We believe the new and improved bridge will draw more attention to the West Bank, an area we often refer to as the final frontier for development. In the last year, new projects, such as Entergy's expansion of the company's Nine Mile Point plant and Dyno Nobel's plans to build an ammonia production facility in Waggaman, along with the bridge improvements, brought more than \$3 billion in investment to the West Bank.

In Fairfield, an area currently undergoing a rebranding and planning process on the West Bank, there's more than 9,000 acres of undeveloped land. The Churchill Technology and Business Park falls within the Fairfield area. It is there that construction continues on the new Patrick F. Taylor Science and Technology Academy, one of the country's top high schools according to both News and World Report. The possibilities for future development on the West Bank are endless and JEDCO continues to actively attract new businesses to the area.

Economic Accolades

It's also been a very exciting couple of months for our local businesses. Just recently, we nominated <u>Cordina New Orleans Cocktails</u> for the 2013 Louisiana Lantern Award, given to manufacturers that exhibit excellence in community engagement and economic successes. The company, which produces frozen adult beverages in environmentally-friendly pouches, <u>won the award in the Greater New Orleans region.</u>

<u>Louisiana Economic Development</u> (LED) also recognized <u>four Jefferson Parish organizations</u> for their commitment to excellence. Jefferson Parish Community Development,



Jefferson Parish Community Action Programs, the Jefferson Parish Business and Career Solutions Center and the Jefferson Parish Animal Shelter were all Level 1 Louisiana Performance Excellence Award recipients.

The four finalists from the <u>Cordina Challenge</u>, JEDCO's first-ever entrepreneur pitch competition during <u>New Orleans Entrepreneur Week</u>, were honored at the Jefferson Chamber Small Business Leadership Awards. Beau Button of <u>Memorandom</u>, Jim Blitch of <u>ZingBoard</u>, Matt Doyle of <u>Clinicate</u> and our winner, Billy Bosch of <u>Be Well Nutrition</u>, <u>Inc.</u> all received 2013 Entrepreneur of the Year awards.

The <u>Louisiana Small Business Development Center</u> in the Greater New Orleans Region <u>was named the top Small Business Development Center in the country</u>. The United States Small Business Administration presented Center Director Carmen Sunda with the award at a private ceremony in Washington D.C. in June.

BIG PROJECTS

Smoothie King Headquarters Returns to Jefferson Parish

- Announced in November 2012
- The frozen drink franchise will move its headquarters later this year, creating 60 high-paying jobs and retaining an additional 45 jobs
- Smoothie King will launch an aggressive growth strategy with plans to open 1,000 new locations in the US and internationally by 2017
- Smoothie King was founded in Jefferson Parish in 1973

Dick's Sporting Goods to Open in Oakwood Center

- Dick's will become the new anchor tenant for the fourth wing of Oakwood Center
- This will revitalize the fourth wing, which has been dormant since Hurricane Katrina
- Will create 270 direct jobs and 150 construction jobs

Starr Textiles Buys Facility in Jefferson Parish

- Announced in March 2013
- Starr Textile Services purchased a new facility in the Elmwood Business Park
- Company provides commercial laundry services to the hospitality industry
- Of the \$10 million investment, JEDCO financed \$4.3 million of it, making it the largest SBA 504 Loan in IEDCO history
- Will create 40 new jobs immediately with an additional 25 jobs in the first two years of financing
- Starr partnered with Kenner companies, Pellerin Laundry Sales and Pellerin Milnor Corporation. The companies will design and equip the new facility.
- New facility set to begin operations in September 2013

Incitec Pivot's Dyno Nobel to Build Ammonia Plant at Cornerstone Chemical in Waggaman

- Announced April 2013
- Incitec Pivot, a global leader in the chemical industry, announced plans to build a state-of-the-art ammonia production facility in Waggaman
- Will build the plant at Cornerstone Chemical Company's Fortier Manufacturing Complex in Waggaman, a partnership worth more than a \$1 billion in investment
 - Ammonia Plant \$850 million
 - Infrastructure expansion, maintenance and upgrades to Cornerstone \$175 million
- Will create 65 new jobs at an average salary of \$55,700
- Will employ more than 470 people indirectly
- 441 employees retained at Cornerstone Chemical
- Construction jobs will peak at 750 jobs in a three-year period
- JEDCO worked closely with Jefferson Parish leaders and Greater New Orleans, Inc. to prepare an incentive package for the project. The negotiations will result in \$45 million in revenue to the parish over the company's first 20 years of operation.

Churchill Technology and Business Park

- Construction Continues on the Patrick F.Taylor Science and Technology Academy
 - Over 100,000 square feet, three main classroom buildings
 - Magnet school listed in Newsweek's Top 1,000 Schools in the U.S.
- Scheduled to be completed for the start of the 2013/2014 school year
- JEDCO Conference Center also scheduled to open fall of 2013




